The outcomes still need to be considered bearing that in mind.</p> <p>Outcomes 2024</p> <p>Those who can swim 25m =73%</p> <p>Those who can use a range of strokes = 76%</p> <p>Those who can apply swimming safety = 65%</p> <p>Unfortunately, we had issues with swimming provision this year as the pool unexpectedly closed and it took us some time to find availability elsewhere. The children were prioritised and ensuring they were able to swim using all strokes confidently was also prioritised in the time that they had.</p>
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
